Jack Moelmann is originally from Oak Park, Illinois (a suburb of Chicago). He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering from Bradley University, Peoria, Illinois in 1965. He retired from the U.S. Air Force as a Colonel in April 1991 after serving in the Communications & Electronics field for 26 years. His last assignment was at Scott Air Force Base, Illinois (near St. Louis) near which he currently lives in the town of O'Fallon, Illinois.

In addition to Jack's Air Force career, he also had a career in music and in particular the organ. Jack started in music (with the piano and soloist in the church choir) at age 8, and has pursued this avocation ever since. His main interests are classical, theatre, and popular stylings on both the organ and the piano. Jack has been a member of the American Theatre Organ Society (ATOS) since 1967, served on their Board of Directors in one capacity or another continuously for the past 18 years, chaired several committees, and was the President of ATOS from 1985 until 1988. He currently serves as the ATOS Secretary and is still on the ATOS Board of Directors. He was elected as the ATOS Honorary Lifetime Member in May 1994.



During his concert career, Double has performed all over the world, including stops in Rochester, NY; Wilmington, DE; Tampa, FL; Chicago, IL; Los Angeles, CA; the famous Casa Loma in Toronto, and two six-week tours throughout Australia. He will make his third trip "down under" in July of 2005. In addition to his hundreds of concerts, he has six CD's to his credit. And, making use of his broadcast talents, Ken has been the Master of Ceremonies of choice for no fewer than 14 American Theatre Organ Society annual and regional conventions. **Don't miss this exciting artist! Doors to the VanDerMolen residence will open at 3:00 pm. You will not be able to gain access to the studios prior to 3:00 pm. The program will begin promptly at 3:30 pm. their music studio with JATOE once again! Directions to the VanDerMolen residence are outlined below:

Coming from the south, take I-355 or IL Rt. 59 north to the Roosevelt Road exit. Proceed west to Main Street in Wheaton (one block west of Naperville Road) (If you are driving from IL Rt. 59 north, follow the signs to turn east on Roosevelt Rd, then left on Main St.) Turn right on Main Street, and proceed north to Harrison St. Turn left on Harrison to Gary Ave. Turn right (North) on Gary to Jewell Road (1st traffic light) Turn left on Jewell Road. Count four (4) streets on the right side of Jewell Road, and turn right on Willow Road. Proceed to the second block. The VanDerMolen residence is the large gray house (3rd) on the left. Watch for the attendant for parking directions, or park in the driveway, or on the west side of the street only.

From the north, take I-355, Illinois Rt. 59, or I-290. Exit at North Avenue, Rt. 64. Go west to Gary Avenue. (If traveling from Rt. 59, turn left, going east on North Ave to Gary.) (White Castle is on the SW corner, about 10 miles from I-290) Turn left and go south about 2 miles to Jewell Rd, the fifth traffic light. Turn right and go west. Count four (4) streets on the right side only of Jewell Road. The fourth street is Willow Road. Turn right, go into the second block. Look for the third house on the left side of the street. **Watch for the attendant for parking directions,** or park in the driveway, or on the west side of the street only.
