When Emily was four years old she told her parents that she was going to be an organist. From age 6 to 9 her piano teachers and parents fielded frequent requests to switch to organ. "Not until your feet can reach the pedals" and "you have to learn piano before you start the organ" did nothing to dissuade her from her quest. At a pipe organ demonstration by Wayne Leupold at Marygrove College in Detroit, Michigan she met classical organ teacher Elaine Grover and began her formal organ studies.

About a year later Emily attended a movie and organ overture at the Redford Theatre in Detroit and heard their 3/10 Barton. After hearing Tony O'Brien, Lance Luce, and John Lauter (who is her current Theatre Organ teacher) she was "hooked" and determined to master the Theatre Organ.

Emily attended the 2007 and 2008 Young Theatre Organ Camp in Chicagoland. In the spring of 2008 she became a regular overture organist at the Redford Theatre. She was honored to be nominated and win the Young Theatre Organist of the Year award in 2008.


Paul Johnson performs at the Rialto on Sunday, August 16

Born right here in Joliet, Paul Johnson has been playing keyboards for over 40 years. At six Paul started on piano and at age ten added the organ to his musical instruction. Paul honed his skills at the organ serving as organist/musician at various area churches. He served as Worship Arts Director in Frankfort and Downers Grove.

Paul's performance and "entertainer" skills were developed in Naperville's top fine dining restaurants during the 1990's. In Chicago he entertained for a year on Rush Street where numerous Chicago celebrities became regular fans. Bill Zwecker of the Chicago Sun Times said, "Paul Johnson tickles those ivories with style, he'll make you smile."

In 1995 he released a CD entitled, "Night Moods," which sold thousands of copies across the country. That made Paul a voting member of the NARAS (the Grammy Association). This year he is composing selections for a new CD of original piano music. Another CD is in the works with Paul's arrangements of Andrew Lloyd Webber songs.

Locally he entertains at the keyboard Monday evenings from 6 to 9 PM at Bonfire Steaks and Seafood in Homer Glen where you can enjoy an outstanding meal with exceptional service in a warm, intimate atmosphere. Paul's "gift" is his ability to convey real emotion through the music he plays. Every note, every chord is like the stroke of an artist's brush on a canvas. "The way I perceive performing is this: There are three elements involved in the process of 'playing' a song. The music itself, the instrument, and the performer. My goal is to merge all three elements into one, creating a living and breathing entity which the listener does not just hear with their ears, but feels

Judy had her choirs participate in festivals in St. Louis, Nashville, Northwestern University, Washington, DC and Walt Disney World. She directed Jr. High Productions of Annie, Guys and Dolls, Fiddler on the Roof and Music Man. Besides teaching music, Judy played the organ for church for 39 years.

Since retiring, Judy spends much of her time enjoying theatre organ socials and conventions; going to the Lyric Opera; Goodman and Drury Lane theatres; singing in church choir; singing in the Elizabethans Madrigal group; and of course playing the organ. Travel is a big part of her life and since she retired she has traveled to Italy, Spain, Sicily, Egypt, Russia, Dubai, UAE, all over the USA and she's taken many cruises. The last cruise was a Trans-Atlantic Crossing and Mediterranean Ports.

Judy is very thankful to have a wonderful family. Mom and Dad (Faye and Bob Wheeler) are still very active and also enjoy traveling. Her children are both married and living on the East Coast. Her daughter, Jill, is a Professor of Theatre at East Carolina University, Greenville, NC. Son, Paul, lives in Brooklyn, NY and works for the Weather Channel in NYC. Although there are no grandchildren yet, two grand dogs are now part of the family.

For Judy, music has been a passion as well as a career. Classical to pop it fills her life and she would like to personally thank Kay McAbee for what he has done for her and the theatre organ community.
