Carl De Santi makes his Rialto Debut!

Carl has been a performer and music professional for forty plus years, playing the organ since he was seven years old. Carl has performed as organist for various special events at Orchestra Hall, The Chicago Theater, Medina Temple and the Coronado Theater in Rockford, Illinois. Carl is locally known in the Western Suburbs of Chicago for his live organ playing at roller skating rinks, is house organist at the Orbit Skate Center in Palatine, Illinois and substitute organist at the Aurora Skate Center, Aurora, Illinois. Carl's organ music has also been heard on Midwest Ballroom aired on WDCB radio, 90.9 FM.

Carl is currently organist and music director for Santa Lucia parish in the Bridgeport neighborhood of Chicago, Illinois. Prior liturgical work included organist at St. Mary's Parish in Riverside, Illinois and music director at Unity Church of Oak Park.

Carl was also a professional actor for many years in Chicago. Carl performed at the Goodman Theatre, Chicago, Illinois in the Joseph Jefferson Award winning production of *Red Noses*. He was also pianist/accompanist for *Forbidden Broadway*, a hilarious spoof Broadway productions in New York City. Carl was a regular in productions at The Drury Lane

Theatre in Evergreen Park, Illinois. Locally, Carl was seen for years in the Johnsonville Brats TV commercials. He also currently performs as a keyboardist and vocalist with music partner Kenned MacIver.

Carl has previously performed socials for CATOE at the Tivoli Theatre in Downers Grove, IL and for CTOS and is honored and delighted to be making his JATOE debut!

ATOS Organist of the Year, Mark Herman at the Rialto!

Mark Herman was born in August of 1987 and currently resides in Indianapolis, Indiana. He has been studying the piano since he was seven years old and began classical organ lessons at the age of twelve. His first introduction to the theatre organ was when he was in fourth grade and was at the Embassy Theatre in downtown Fort Wayne. This was made possible by the late Robert Goldstine and the local American Guild of Organists chapter's "Room on the Organ Bench" program. In 2001, he began theatre organ studies with John Ferguson of Indianapolis, who is recognized worldwide for his skills as a teacher.

In the summer of 2003, Mark was given the opportunity to play a cameo performance at the American Theatre Organ Society's (ATOS) annual convention in Oakland, California. The following year, he won the ATOS Young Theatre Organist Competition in Milwaukee at the Riverside Theatre. That enabled him to perform a critically acclaimed concert for the ATOS 50th Anniversary Convention in Pasadena, which took place the following July. During the summer of 2006, he toured for six weeks in Australia and New Zealand, setting records in CD sales at many of the venues in which he appeared. In 2009, he returned for a second 7-week tour of those countries. Over the past few years, he has played dozens of solo concerts in theatres and venues from coast to coast. He is a graduate of The Theatre School, DePaul University in Chicago where he received a Bachelor of Fine Arts de-

gree in Theatre Arts with a focus in Theatre Management. In addition to playing the organ, Mark has also been known to perform on the piano, as well as introduce several original compositions. Mark is a proud endorsee of Hammond Organs and Leslie Speakers for Hammond Suzuki USA. Mark currently resides in Indianapolis, Indiana where he is Sales Director at the Phoenix Theatre, a professional live theatre presenting contemporary works.
