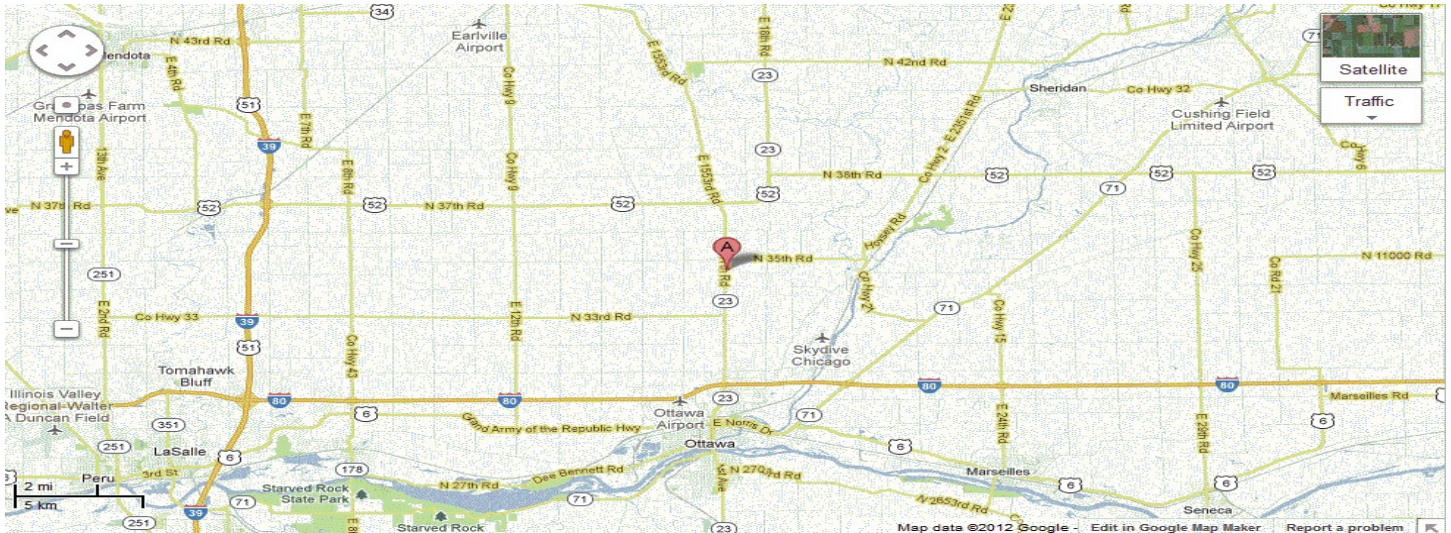

Jelani Eddington to perform at the Gallops/Dissell Residence, September 8th!

The Gallops/Dissell residence is located at **3460 N State Road 23, Ottawa, IL 61350**. A map showing the exact location is below. The easy way to get there with no GPS is to get on your closest Interstate and go to exit 90 on I-80 West. Once at exit 90, turn right and go 4.6 miles north on IL State Route 23. The house number is on the black mail box (there are two of them together) by the side of the road. The residence is the only house going north that is 1/4 of a mile off the road on the right. All other houses are close to the road. There is a red barn and house on the other side of the road from the driveway. **Please watch for the parking attendant as he will direct you to a spot to park. The doors will open at 1:30pm, and the concert will begin at 2:00pm. Limited open console will follow the program. You may bring refreshments to share if you would like.**



Zach Frame return to the Barton on October 13th!

Born and raised in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, Zach has an Associates Degree of Applied Science in Recording Technology from McNally Smith College of Music in St. Paul, Minnesota. He discovered the theatre pipe organ when he was 5, and in 2003, Zach was the first recipient of the George Wright Fellowship from the American Theatre Organ Society. This allowed him to attend the annual convention of ATOS in San Diego, California.

Equally at home behind the console as in front of it, Zach enjoys the technical side of the theatre pipe organ as well, and is helping assemble a large theatre organ in Wisconsin. Aside from the organ, Zach also plays the drums and saxophone and is in several jazz groups in Wisconsin and Illinois. As a recording engineer, Zach currently has several albums in progress with well-known organists across the country. Zach is one of the staff organists at Organ Piper Pizza in Greenfield, Wisconsin.

Doors to the Rialto open at 1:30pm and Zach's program will begin at 2:00pm. Please bring a refreshment of your choice to share. Open console will follow the program. We welcome our sister chapter, CTOS to this social event!
