Dr. STEVEN BALL

...........

Steven Ball has recently been named as Director of Sacred Music at The Oratory of St. Francis de Sales in St. Louis, Missouri. The Oratory is famous for a unique and varied choral repertoire spanning several centuries and performed by numerous ensembles. The liturgies are conducted exclusively in Latin using the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, the universal form of the Roman Catholic Liturgy before the changes which followed the Second Vatican Council. As such it provides a unique cultural and musical setting in which the music of some of the greatest composers for sacred choral and organ music can be heard in their original context.

A native of Michigan originally, Dr. Ball studied at the University of Michigan where he later went on to teach, serve as University Carillonneur, and the Director of the famous Stearns Collection of Musical Instruments. He received his DMA in 2007 as a student of Marilyn Mason. A former Fulbright Scholar to the Netherlands, Steven Ball is also well known for his work in the world of campanology (the study of bells), improvisation, as an organ consultant, for silent film accompaniment and as a theater organist. He has traveled and performed extensively in both the United States and abroad including concerts in the Netherlands, Germany, Belgium, France, Portugal, Ireland, England, Switzerland and Italy. He was inducted as a Knight of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem (a Papal Knighthood) in 2017.

He comes to this position from New Jersey where he last served as Organist and Director of Outreach (now Emeritus) for the world's largest pipe organ located in Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City. His time there also included a position at the Cathedral Basilica of Sts. Peter and Paul in Philadelphia, PA. Previous to his appointments in Atlantic City and Philadelphia and while serving on the faculty of the Organ Department at the University of Michigan, he also served as Cathedral Organist at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral in Detroit and Senior Staff Organist at the Michigan Theater in Ann Arbor.

St. Francis de Sales Oratory is one of the largest and most important examples of gothic revival architecture in the nation. Tied for 6th tallest church tower in the United States, it is located on historic Route 66 and is open daily for visitors. Named America's most beautiful church in a recent nationwide contest, the church is served by priests from the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest.









We started a membership drive back in January 2018. The goal was set at 17 new members by May of 2019. I asked for your help, and you delivered. From Pipes to Virtual Pipe Organ to Pipes

As the old saying goes, "What goes Around, Comes Around". That seems to be the case with my Virtual Pipe Organ's.

It all started some twenty five years ago, maybe longer when I bought nine ranks of theater organ pipes. There was no console, relay or blower, so everything sat in storage for a couple of years, until I found a two manual Wurlitzer console and a blower. I designed and built a diode keying relay system, which was replaced by an Artisan midi keying system.

All was fine, until someone told me about this three manual electronic organ that someone had built. Well, that was the start of the Virtual Theater Pipe Organ part of the story. After stripping out all the old vacuum tube tone generators for a new midi system, it was decided that I didn't want to use the Artisan uMidi cards because of the long configuration files that was have to be written. After researching what else was available, I thought there had to be a better way, which was the start of my own midi cards and DTS MIDI Systems.

The home three manual console is operating on Hauptwerk and a small PC computer. The theater organ samples include the Paramount Organs ranging from the 3-10 to the 4-50, as well as a couple of Barton and Morton samples. Audio is broken down to ten channels that are routed to four pair of right and left speakers for channels 1 to 8. Audio channels 9 and 10 are routed to a 12 inch sub-woofer. To add some big sound, reverberation is provided through a software program called Reaper. The end result is a very pleasing in the theater, theater organ sound.

As I said at the beginning, what goes around, comes around, so back to the pipes. The nine rank pipe organ is played using an Allen three manual theater organ console that has been converted to full midi in and output. It is running Hauptwerk Virtual Organ software, and the Paramount Organ Works 341 sample set that in turn is driving


