Dave Calendine, a Warren, Ohio native, started his musical career with the player piano at the age of 3. By age 5, he was playing some of the music without the aid of the player mechanism. By age 7, he was playing at his church, where he also started to teach himself the organ at age 15.

When at age 16, Dave first heard the magnificent sound of the theatre organ, he was instantly hooked and determined to play the theatre organ at whatever the cost. His wish came true when, one night after a movie, the management of the Akron Civic Theatre let him play. Shortly after that, he was hired as one of the house organist at the 2,678-seat movie

palace. The youngest person to ever hold the position, he entertained audiences there for over 3 years.


After leaving the Akron Civic Theatre, he continued on, playing at several restaurants featuring theatre pipe organs, such as the Organ Grinder (Toronto, Canada), and Shady Nook (Cincinnati, Ohio). Dave has also played several theatre pipe organs throughout the United States and Canada. In 2000, he went on his first overseas solo concert tour through Germany and Switzerland, playing to packed houses.

Dave currently holds the position of House Organist for Detroit's fabulous Fox Theatre, holding that position for 25 years now. He has also played nine years for the Radio City Music Hall Christmas Spectacular, featuring the world-famous Rockettes. He is also one of two organists at Little Caesars Arena in Detroit, playing the organ for home games of the Detroit Red Wings NHL team.

Dave's enthusiasm for the theatre and theatre pipe organ has him serving as Chairman of the Board of Directors for the American Theatre Organ Society. He has also been the Chairman of the Board of Directors and President of the Motor City Theatre Organ Society, which owns and operates the Redford Theatre in Detroit. He has also been on the Board of Directors and Treasurer of the Detroit Theatre Organ Society, which owns and operates the Senate Theater, as well as a former President of the Flint Theatre Organ Club, an auxiliary support group for the Flint Institute of Music.

Taylor Trimby grew up in Joliet and in 1966 he attended a concert by Kay McAbee at the Rialto Theatre, playing the 4/21 Barton Grand. He was instantly hooked. Since then, Kay's styling has had a big influence on his own. He began studying organ with Rosemary Zolecki at age 13 and at 15 became the staff organist at the Rialto, a position he held for many years. He was a member of the JATOE work crew for 15+ years and is currently on the CATOE work crew and a member of the CATOE and ATOS board of directors. He installed a 2/7 Marr & Colton Theatre Organ that came from the Dexter Theatre in Detroit in his basement and now has 3 manual Marr & Colton console from the State Theatre in Toledo Ohio which is setup as a virtual theatre organ

running Hauptwerk and the Paramount 4/50 sample set. The installation was featured a few years ago in Theatre Organ magazine.

He has one son who is a professor, teaching biology and bio-engineering at the University of Delaware. His sister is a classical organist and plays at Plymouth Congregational Church in Plainfield Illinois. Now that Taylor is retired, while it affords him more time doing the things he loves like riding roller coasters, golfing, spending time in the theatre organ world, getting things ready for the Chicago ATOS convention and of course spending more time with his Dalmatian Joey, it does not mean anything is slowing down. Quite the opposite, Taylor finds himself a very busy man.



Mesa pizza restaurant organist dies from stroke complications.

A longtime organist at a pizza shop in Mesa died Nov. 21, 2019 from complications of a stroke. Charlie Balogh was the organist at Organ Stop Pizza in Mesa before his death. "Organ Stop Pizza has truly lost a great talent and wonderful human being," the restaurant said in a statement. "Charlie leaves behind an incredible legacy, especially in the organ world," the statement continued "No words can express our sadness at Charlie's death or our gratitude for his

commitment and love for Organ Stop Pizza through the years. "Balogh, a New Jersey native, began musical instruction when he was just 11 years old and continued through classical organ instruction at Trenton State College. He began his professional playing career at the Phoenix Organ Stop in 1973 before spending 14 years performing at The Roaring 20's restaurant starting in 1976 and moving back to Arizona in 1991. Balogh had also been named "Organist of the Year" by the American Theatre Organ Society in 2006. Our own Glenn Tallar is now a substitute organists at Organ Stop Pizza. A very busy man for sure. Glenn will be playing from 12-14 to 12-17 and 12-21 to 12-23. You can see the organists schedule here.
