Membership Meeting and Elections



JATOE WORK CREW AT IT AGAIN!

The work crew is back to work. The chimes made it thru Christmas but needed to be re-leathered. The black rubberized cloth was failing. It lasted 37 years. All 25 pneumatics were re-covered with leather. Also, new power supplies are being considered for the chambers, and some electrical work needs to be done in the lower solo chamber for the lighting so the extension cords will no longer run thru the swell shades. Slowly but surely we are making progress with the help and guidance of David Rhodes. Our goal is to eventually repair all that needs to be repaired and then it will just require some routine yearly maintenance and tunings. The Barton will be a polished jewel in the Rialto's crown and the world class instrument that it was meant to be. The Lobby Organ blower motor is still being repaired by Joliet Electric. It will be like brand new when they finish. Hopefully it will be reinstalled by the end of February or the beginning of March. The Lobby Organ is unique and exclusive to the Rialto Theater alone. No other theater in the greater Chicagoland area has a lobby organ let alone one that is played from the main console. Just another jewel in the Rialto's crown.
